Held on July 3, 2025. We took a deep dive into learning analytics and how data can be leveraged to drive skill-building and personalized learning paths.



Series #5 | Key Strategies for a Smooth Transition and Scaling Moodle 5.0 for High Performance"

Held on July 17, 2025. In our final pre-event webinar, experts shared migration strategies and optimization tips to scale Moodle 5.0 across institutions effectively.



Executive Summary Day I

Day 1 of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 officially opened with a warm welcome at the Universitas Terbuka Convention Center, marking the beginning of a twoconvergence of educators, day technologists, and digital learning innovators from across the country. The atmosphere energetic, with was participants eager to explore the theme: "Empowering Learning through Innovation with Al, Data & Gamification."

The majority of registered participants were present and actively engaged throughout the day—representing a diverse mix of institutions from across Indonesia. With over 90% turnout, the event reflected the strong enthusiasm and relevance of Moodle in today's evolving digital learning landscape.

The day began with two powerful keynotes-one from national education leader highlighting empowerment through digital tools, and another from Moodle HQ presenting the platform's evolving vision and commitment to openness and innovation.

A thought-provoking panel followed, where leaders from Universitas Padjadjaran and Universitas Indonesia discussed the real-world application of hybrid learning strategies and institutional collaboration. These discussions served as a strong reminder that while technology is important, pedagogy and people are at the heart of transformative education.

Midday sessions shifted focus to the power of AI in education, inclusive skills development, and social impact, with speakers ranging from national tech experts to social innovators. These sessions inspired participants to rethink how they design and deliver learning—not only for performance but for purpose.

The second half of the day was dedicated to hands-on workshops across four tracks, offering 12 diverse topics designed for educators, instructional designers, LMS admins, and developers. Topics ranged from mobile course design and gamification to proctoring tools and large-scale system performance—ensuring that every attendee could find a session that matched their unique needs.

The "Ask Anything the Experts" sessions were particularly popular, creating a rare space for direct consultation with Moodle specialists and system integrators. Day 1 closed on a high note—with interactive games, surprise giveaways, and renewed energy to return for Day 2.





Executive Sumary Day 2

Day 2 of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 picked up right where the first day left off—only this time, the spotlight shifted toward strategy, measurement, and institutional impact. The audience was a dynamic mix of returning participants and fresh faces, reflecting growing interest in Moodle's practical applications across corporate, academic, and hybrid learning environments.

With a strong retention rate from Day 1 and new joiners from various sectors, Day 2 maintained an equally high level of engagement—underscoring the event's relevance beyond the education sector alone. Participants represented a wide spectrum of institutions, demonstrating Moodle's flexibility and adaptability in diverse organizational contexts.

Keynote sessions from Moodle HQ and DANA Indonesia framed the conversation: how do we build learning ecosystems that not only function but flourish? From skill certifications to gamified platforms, the morning talks provided frameworks and case studies showing how Moodle can be used to align learning initiatives with tangible business and societal outcomes.

A powerful panel featuring speakers from Universitas YARSI and Monash University Indonesia sparked meaningful dialogue around accessibility, data-driven insights, and scalable learning design—showcasing how Moodle is being leveraged for inclusive transformation at both local and international levels.





Midday featured a standout talk from Monash's L&T team, offering a transparent look at how AI-integrated assessments are being adopted in higher education, complete with lessons learned from implementation on the ground.







Recapping Day-1 Attendance #MootID25

Day 1 of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 was marked by high energy and active participation from across Indonesia. With 169 participants registered from 86 institutions, and 159 of them joining live from 82 institutions, the event saw a vibrant turnout. Each session—be it plenary or breakout—buzzed with collaboration, curiosity, and ideas that pushed the boundaries of learning innovation.













Recapping Day-2 Attendance #MootID25

Day 2 of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 welcomed both returning and new faces, with 154 registered participants from 84 institutions and 121 joining from 71 institutions. The discussions shifted toward strategy and implementation—covering learning impact, AI, and scalable infrastructure. The strong attendance reaffirmed the growing commitment of the community to adopt and expand digital learning solutions in meaningful ways.

The first day of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 began with a powerful set of keynote sessions that set a clear tone: digital learning must be inclusive, visionary, and deeply human-centered.

- Prof. Dr. Paulina Pannen, M.LS, Founder of ICE Institute, delivered a resonant opening
 keynote titled "Learning Digital Empowerment for Women Educators & Leaders." She
 shared the importance of enabling women educators to become changemakers in a
 digital-first world, underscoring the transformative role of online learning technologies
 like Moodle. Her keynote called for equitable access, digital literacy, and inclusive
 leadership as pillars of future-ready education.
- Matt Porritt, Head of Platform Solutions at Moodle HQ, followed with "Crafting The
 Future of Learning: Inside Moodle's Product Vision." With insights from Moodle's
 global roadmap, he outlined how the platform is evolving to support Al-enhanced
 learning, data-driven personalization, and modular flexibility—ensuring that Moodle
 remains the most open, scalable, and community-driven LMS in the world.



Day-1 Experts Talk Hi-Flex Strategies with Moodle



Hi-Flex Design and Collaborative Strategies with Moodle

In an era where hybrid learning is the new normal, this panel brought practical insights from leading Indonesian universities, **Hana Rizmadewi Agustina**, **S.Kp.**, **MN.**, **Ph.D**, Head of Distance Learning Management – Universitas Padjadjaran, and **FA Triatmoko HS.**, **S.Psi.**, **M.Si**, Head of Digital Learning Program Development and Marketing – Universitas Indonesia, discussed how Moodle is being leveraged to design highly flexible (Hi-Flex) learning environments. Their session highlighted the importance of institutional collaboration, agile content delivery, and the role of technology in fostering active, student-centered experiences across both synchronous and asynchronous formats.



Featured Presentations Day-1

This segment featured thought leaders who challenged conventional thinking and introduced new possibilities for digital learning transformation:













Prof. Onno W. Purbo, Rector – Institut Teknologi Tangerang Selatan, delivered an eye-opening talk titled "Learning Transformed: The Era of Al-Powered Education." He presented real-world use cases of Al in education—from intelligent tutoring systems to automated assessment tools—making a strong case for how educators and institutions must adapt quickly to the era of automation and data-driven teaching.

Ageng Sajiwo, Director of Futureskills.id – PIJAR Foundation, closed the session with "Digital Learning for Social Impact: Inclusive Approaches to Future Skills for All." He emphasized that beyond technology, the core goal is to democratize access to future-oriented skills. By using Moodle as an open platform, institutions can reach diverse learners—especially those underserved—and build a more inclusive talent pipeline for Indonesia's digital economy.



Day-1 Breakout Session Tracks: Where Strategy Meets Execution

In the afternoon, participants explored specialized topics through hands-on sessions held in four breakout rooms, each designed to serve different segments of the Moodle user community.

Owl Room brought together experts focused on pedagogy and engagement.

Dr. Intan Nurma Yulita. (Universitas Padjadjaran) discussed how educators can integrate AI tools into their teaching practices, while **Affifudin** (Moodle **Functional** Specialist PCMan) shared strategies for designing gamified learning journeys in Moodle. Nisrina Rifa Salma (Customer Success & Product Manager - Prospera Buana) closed the track with an insightful session on preventing academic dishonesty through Al-powered exam integrity.

Beaver Room

Beaver Room catered to course creators and LMS admins with a focus on learner experience and scalable delivery.

Advan Class & Nur Azizah (PCMan) demonstrated mobile-first course design using branded Moodle apps, followed by **Dr. Kartono** (Universitas Terbuka) who shared lessons from deploying over a thousand Moodle courses in a semester. Untung Dwi Prasetyo (PCMan) wrapped up with a walkthrough on building smarter classrooms virtual using BigBlueButton, pedagogy, and analytics.

Fox Room was tailored for technical teams and system admins managing performance and integration at scale.

Andrian Hartanto (Partner Support Engineer - Moodle HQ) opened with best practices for large Moodle deployments, followed by Pandu (Partner Wicaksono Technical Specialist - IBM) who presented smarter monitoring approaches for virtual learning infrastructure. Adam Nugroho (BFI Sulistyo Finance) closed with a practical session on integrating Moodle LMS with Power Bl for data visualization.

Dolphin Room was the go-to track for developers and integration specialists.

Egi Rizaki (Senior Infrastructure Engineer PCMan) discussed scalable Moodle cloud architecture powered by Pax8, while the PCMan Technical Consultant Team hosted two open-format "Ask Anything the Experts" where sessions, participants received real-time guidance on plugin optimization, site performance, API and integration—making this the most consultative and interactive room of the day.

Fox Room

Day 1 concluded with engaging games, live quizzes, and lucky draw prizes—but more importantly, with stronger community bonds, sharper technical understanding, and a renewed commitment to building inclusive, Al-powered learning ecosystems.













The second day of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 continued to energize the community with a strong focus on building future-ready digital learning ecosystems—powered by skills, strategy, and meaningful data.

- Max Espley, APAC & Canada Channel Manager Moodle HQ, opened the morning with "Inside
 The Moodle Programme: Building Skills, Knowledge, and Community." His session emphasized
 the global momentum of the Moodle Educator Certification Program (MEQ) and how structured
 upskilling, peer-led support, and community building are essential to the long-term success of
 Moodle implementation in any context—education or enterprise.
- Minh Hanh Nguyen, Head of LMS Division Pimenko, followed with a compelling case study on
 "LudiLearn: Increasing Learner Motivation and Performance through Adaptive Gamification."
 She demonstrated how LudiLearn's intelligent gamification layer, integrated into Moodle, is
 reshaping learner motivation and tracking performance through adaptive mechanics—a model
 worth watching for institutions across Asia.
- Stephanie Harto, Head of People Learning & Enrichment DANA Indonesia, bridged the
 education and corporate world in her session "Upskilling and Reskilling for the Future: How to
 Align Learning with Business Goals." She highlighted how platforms like Moodle can be
 customized to develop talent pipelines, track learning ROI, and enable organizational agility in a
 fast-changing digital economy.



Day-2 Panel on Measurable Learning Experiences



From Access to Insight: Building Inclusive and Measurable Learning Experiences with Moodle

This panel discussion brought together institutional leaders and edtech researchers to explore how digital learning can be made more inclusive—while ensuring measurable outcomes, Andreas Febrian, S.Kom., M.Kom., Ph.D, Director of Distance Learning – Universitas YARSI, and Rinda Saski Kurnia, Senior Officer Education Governance – Monash University Indonesia

Together, they discussed the importance of accessibility, culturally responsive design, and actionable analytics. The panel emphasized Moodle's flexibility in adapting to different pedagogical and institutional contexts, as well as the power of learning data to support evidence-based decision-making at all levels.



Featured Presentations Day-2

Anddy Steven Sumampouw, SFHEA (Senior Manager Learning & Teaching, Monash University Indonesia) and Maharani Pratiwi (Learning Analyst, Monash University Indonesia) presented "Digital Learning Uplift: Strategies, Lesson Learned, and Al-Integrated Assessment."

This session offered a practical framework for implementing Al-driven assessments in higher education, along with lessons learned from Monash's continuous improvement cycle in teaching innovation.





Day-2 Breakout Sessions: Mastering Integration, Security & Assessment

The second day of MoodleMoot Indonesia 2025 continued with another set of hands-on workshops across four specialized breakout rooms—each designed to empower participants with practical skills and in-depth strategies based on their roles and needs.

Owl Room

Owl Room focused on empowering educators to design meaningful learning experiences and measure real impact. Marisca Revani Putri (Learning Experience Program Manager – GreatNusa) opened the track with an insightful session on creating effective assessments in Moodle. She was followed by Haniyo Sakyamuni (Monash University) who demonstrated interactive learning design using H5P tools. M. Soleh Al Hakim, MM, CGMHR (Senior Facilitator – Binus Business School & Binus Creates) rounded off the room with a reflective sharing on implementing digital learning strategies from an L&D practitioner's perspective.

Beaver Room

Beaver Room offered a dynamic mix of sessions for course creators and LMS admins. Christine Sandy from SunEdu, as the official MEQ Provider, introduced the Moodle Educator Qualification as a pathway to empower teaching excellence. Stephany Soekandar (Xendit Indonesia) and Alif Syaha P (PCMan) presented monetization models for Moodle-based platforms, while Rizal Masandiansyah (Moodle Functional Specialist Lead – PCMan) brought a technical edge with a deep dive into Moodle's Al-Subsystem, featuring integrations with Azure, Ollama, and IBM Granite LLMs.



Fox Room

Fox Room catered to the infrastructure and system architecture side of Moodle. Andior Ezra Damongilala (Sangfor) outlined best practices for securing virtualization environments for Moodle deployments. Deo Kiatama (DevOps Engineer – Moodle HQ) introduced LiteLLM as a scalable private LLM gateway, and the Pax8 Team closed the session with a forward-looking approach to Al-powered cybersecurity in digital learning ecosystems.

Dolphin Room

Dolphin Room addressed technical customization and system integration. Wahyu Sasongko (Senior Software Developer – PCMan) shared integration strategies for connecting Moodle with HRIS and SIS platforms. The PCMan Technical Consultant Team also returned with two high-energy "Ask Anything the Experts" sessions, maintaining the interactive format where participants received real-time, tailored solutions for their implementation challenges—making it one of the most engaging parts of the day.

Day 2 concluded with interactive quizzes, prize giveaways, and group photo sessions. More importantly, it reinforced the core message of the event: that innovation in education is not about tools alone, but about building a community that's curious, capable, and ready to co-create a smarter, more inclusive learning future.


